Spelling can be terrifying

Some words you just have to learn letter by letter - and that's hard going.
But if you know the rules in this booklet then huge amounts of words become easy.

## Learn Your Spellings

1. When you're learning to spell a word for the first time, look at it written down, and say it again and again.
2. Copy it out over and over again.
3. Say the word one syllable at a time (over and over again). e.g. ex-tra-ord-in-ar-y.
4. Write a sentence to help you remember. e.g. might Moths In Gardens Hug Trees.

## If You Forget How To Spell A Word

1. Think about the rules in this booklet
2. Think about words that sound familiar. Maybe your tricky word is spelt in a similar way. e.g. sign, design.
3. Try writing the word down a few different ways - sometimes one way will just look right.
4. If you're not doing a test you can look it up in a dictionary.

## Adding s to make words plural

## To make most words plural, just add s.

$$
\operatorname{dog} \Longrightarrow \text { dogs } \quad \text { worm } \Longrightarrow \text { worms } \quad \text { pill } \Longrightarrow \text { pills }
$$

\text { If the word ends in } \boldsymbol{h} \text {, } \text { s or } \boldsymbol{x} \text {, add es. }
$$

wish $\Longrightarrow$ wishes $\quad$ brush $\Longrightarrow$ brushes
bus $\quad$ buses glass $\longrightarrow$ glasses
box $\Longrightarrow$ boxes
fox $\Longrightarrow$ foxes

For words that end with a consonant and $\mathbf{y}$, take off the $y$ and add ies.
fly $\Longrightarrow$ flies $\quad$ city $\Longrightarrow$ cities
jelly $\Longrightarrow$ jellies $\quad$ berry $\Longrightarrow$ berries

These plurals don't end in s-you have to learn them.

## Making words ending in $\underline{o}$ or a plural

## To make most words ending in $\underline{o}$ and $\underline{a}$ plural, just add s.

| armadillo | $\Longrightarrow$ | armadillos | samosa | $\Longrightarrow$ | samosas |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| igloo | $\longrightarrow$ | igloos | umbrella | $\square$ | umbrellas |
| piano | $\Rightarrow$ | pianos | pizza | $\Longrightarrow$ | pizzas |
| cello | $\Longrightarrow$ | cellos | sofa | $\Longrightarrow$ | sofas |

## You have to add es to some of the words that end in o to make them plural.

## Making words ending in $\underline{f}$ plural

## Add $s$ to any word ending in ff to make it a plural.

cuff $\Longrightarrow$ cuffs
cliff $\Longrightarrow$ cliffs
earmuff $\Longrightarrow$ earmuffs
puff $\Longrightarrow$ puffs

Add es to a word ending in $\underline{f}$ or $\underline{f e}$, and change the $\underline{f}$ to $\mathrm{a} \underline{\mathbf{v}}$.
half $\Longrightarrow$ halves calf $\quad$ calves
loaf $\Longleftrightarrow$ loaves wolf $\Longleftrightarrow$ wolves
scarf $\Longrightarrow$ scarves
shelf $\Longrightarrow$ shelves

A short vowel is the $\underline{\underline{a}}$ as in plan, a long vowel sound is the a in plane.
