All NPTC Group students can vote in the Student Union elections. You can only vote once, and you cannot change your vote once submitted.


Make sure you read the manifestos below and vote for who you think the best person for the role is, based on their plans, their experience, and their strengths. The person with the most votes will be offered the role.

An SU that is known, respected, and celebrated as a symbol of who we are.


Why Vote for Me?



Kieya Hurford


